Oregon Training Facility

You'll see and experience a different atmosphere as we have now transitioned into our winter training season. We have integrated many improvements over the last few months.

We hired a cleaning crew. Turns out our volunteer cleaning rotations didn't work like we wanted, so we have a crew coming in every week. Nonetheless, please help keep the facility as clean as possible while you're there.

We are transitioning to using the double doors that are in the middle of the building. Moving to the double doors will allow for better energy efficiency, cost savings, and better traffic flow in and

out of the building. There is also a set of benches and hooks in the main hallway that can be used by incoming players to store their belongings. We'll also be bringing in industrial strength floor mats. Please remember to have your players wear boots outside and change into flats inside.

While you may never see it, we have also repurposed the upstairs into two spaces. The first is a meeting room. This is where we'll hold our board meetings and coaches can hold team meetings / video trainings. The second space has been turned into a performance enhancement space.

We are excited to share that our very own, Coach Brian Feyrer, will be using the performance space for his business, Performance Edge, to provide personal and team-based trainings.

Performance Edge will be running group sessions at the indoor facility for many of the 56er players this winter. I'm excited to have the opportunity to help the players increase their athleticism and resistance to injury. These are key components to helping the players and teams improve their abilities and success on the field.
